



Become an Assistant Professor of Landscape Architecture, at the Intersection of Urban Planning

The [Faculty of Environmental Design](#) of the Université de Montréal, founded in 1968, is home to three schools: the School of Architecture, the School of Design, and the School of Urban Planning and Landscape Architecture. - Supervise undergraduate and graduate students, in both professional and research programs;
- Develop a high-level research program addressing cutting-edge issues in landscape architecture and urban planning;
- Participate actively in the academic life, functioning and development of the School, Faculty and institution through contributions to committees and working groups;
- Contribute to the advancement of research and practice in landscape architecture and urban planning, and to the reputation of the Université de Montréal, through lectures, publications, and other significant scientific and professional activities.

Qualifications

- Hold a Ph.D. in landscape architecture, urban planning, or a related discipline to environmental design. Applications from candidates who have submitted their thesis may be considered;
- Demonstrate the ability to provide high-quality teaching and guidance at all three academic levels at the intersection of landscape architecture and urban planning;
- Demonstrate the ability to integrate the disciplines of landscape architecture and urban planning into teaching and research;
- Have the ability and experience to work in a team in an interdisciplinary context and in collaboration with faculty members;
- The following are considered assets:
 - A bachelor's or master's degree in landscape architecture;
 - Experience in teaching or practice in development projects and design;
- Have adequate proficiency of the French language **or** be committed to learning it once hired, through the Université de Montréal's French language support program, in accordance with the [Université de Montréal language policy](#).
